The Frostville name has historical significance in this part of the Western Reserve. Dr. Elias Carrington Frost settled on Kennedy Ridge about 1819. He opened a post office in 1829. He called the postal station Frostville although it was within the township first called Lenox and later called Olmsted.

After the official name of the postal station was changed to Olmsted, the Frostville designation of the surrounding area remained. It seemed appropriate to reclaim this early name when choosing a name for the museum campus.

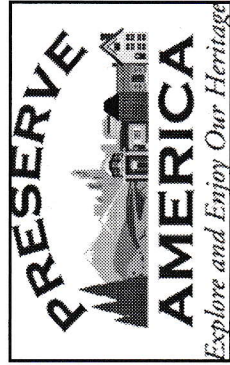
